 To provide direct academic support for 9th-grade METCO students in their transition to Brookline High School. The BHS Advisor/Liaison will supervise this in conjunction with services provided by Livius Prep. Livius Prep provides tutors across all content areas with a specialization in physics and English (<u>https://www.liviusprep.com/</u>). The \$15,000 will go directly to Livius Prep for their services. Livius Prep will provide academic tutors to work with 9th-grade METCO students after school. It will be mandated for any student falling in warning and/or needing improvement on their Interim Progress Report (IPR). However, it is open to additional 9th-grade students at BHS, depending upon space availability and requests.
