Also swings are not appropriate for age of kids using them This might be something the parents could take on as a cause - contact Green Dogs program, reach out to Parks to ask about swings Anne's experience is that the kids are generally happy with the space - just might take some getting used to Could we get pop up soccer goals to accommodate other sports (Jamie will order) Can we put up a sign that says "this is a school park, please clean up after your dogs" – except there are regs in Brookline about hanging your own signs. Would need to be posted by parks and rec, or we need permission for kids to hang signs Feedback re cafeteria/food Many of the issues have been addressed by communicating back to food services Jamie will send photos of food to families for reassurance - lots of great options Feedback re the bus Kids only want to share seats with friends, kids were not riding the correct bus, behavior is an issue Some issues are resolving: w bus passes crowding has eased A significant minority of kids are the ones causing the problems - needs to be self-enforced because no bus monitors A knock on effect is that kids are rushing out of the building to get the seats they want on the bus, which means they are not staying to ask questions to tea
